2011 Alumni Association Scholarships

The application for Alumni Association Scholarships (\$1,000) is at our website www.columbussouthhighalumni.com or www.southhighalumni.org. There are three categories of eligibility for applicants for the SHSAA Scholarship: one category applies to currently enrolled SHS seniors; two categories apply to family members of SHSAA Active Members.

1. The applicant must be a member of the current senior class at South High School. The applicant must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
2. A senior at a high school other than South – The applicant must be a graduating senior; must have a GPA of 3.0; and must be a family member of an Active Member of the SHSAA.
3. A student currently enrolled and attending a college, university, or trade school (this includes former recipients of an SHSAA scholarship who would like to renew their scholarship grant) – The applicant must have successfully completed two semesters or two quarters at an accredited school. The applicant must verify a GPA of 2.5 for the two most recent semesters or quarters. The applicant must be a family member of an Active Member of SHSAA.

Bulldog Grapplers Stock On The Rise

The South High Wrestling Team became Dormant in 2003. In 2007 that changed with the hiring of wrestling coach Felix Catheline. The winter of 07/08 the Bulldogs finished second to last (15/16) in the city, and had two wrestlers place in the top 6. They had 12 total team members. The winter of 08/09 they finished 13th and had two wrestlers place in the top 6. Team numbers increased to 19. The winter of 09/10 was a big year for the program. Through the efforts of South’s principal Dr. Jonetta Wiley they were able to obtain a wrestling room in the newly renovated building on Ann Street. Coach Catheline was also able to hire two assistant coaches due to the numbers increasing from 19 to 31 wrestlers. Assistant coaches Fred Parish and Matt Bruskotter bring a wealth of experience. Coach Parish was a member of the OSU wrestling team, and both Coach Parish and Coach Bruskotter are members of the competition team with Coach Catheline at Buckeye MMA. The winter of 09/10 the Bulldogs finished 6th in the city championship. They had 5 wrestlers finish in the top 6 with 2 second place finishes. Also, for the first time under Coach Catheline’s South tenure the team had four 5th place finishes at the sectional tournament.

This year they have 28 members on the team and are currently 4-3 in dual action and had a tournament champion on Dec. 4th at the Upper Arlington Lee Spitzer Championship Classic at Heavyweight Class. The team’s goal this year is clear. They want to finish within the top 3 of the city championship, and they want to send at least 3 kids to the district division II tournament.

The Bulldogs have the distinct honor of hosting the City League Championships on Saturday, February 12th. All Alumni, particularly wrestling team alum, are encouraged to attend. Volunteers are also desired. For more information please contact Larry Latta at 614/203-8737 (LATTA1013@AOL.COM).



Charity Newsies

I received quick and interesting responses to my request for names of people who were or are working as members of the Charity Newsies. The annual drive this year was on Saturday, December 11, 2010. The Newsies will provide clothes for over 12,000 needy school kids in the Columbus area this year at a cost of \$140 per child. This money is raised by Newsies selling copies of a special edition of the *Columbus Dispatch* at busy intersections around town and by other contributions. This year, the 104th annual sale of newspapers reached \$494,256, a 9.2% increase over last year's proceeds.

Jim McCoy ('67) sent this email: "Frank McCathran (brother of Peggy McCathran who is Vice President of the SHSAA Board of Directors) and I are both Charity Newsies. I have been selling Newsie papers every year since 1968. I used to work for the old *Columbus Citizen-Journal* newspaper and there are lots of old newspaper boys who are Newsies. In fact, the official name of the organization is the 'Ohio Newsboys Association.' "

Jim moved to Florida in 1992 but always comes back to Columbus on the 2nd Saturday of December to sell Charity Newsie papers. He says that Frank McCathran has been a Newsie for several years and they both sell papers at Leap Rd. and Cemetery Rd.

I also got a phone call from Bob Cloud ('66) telling me that five past presidents of Charity Newsies are South High School graduates. Bob contacted these men and I received bios from four. The past presidents are: Bob Cloud ('66); Nathaniel Woods ('62); Tom Beck ('50); Don Lund ('43); and Tom Boley (also a 1940s grad).

You will understand the pride all of us Bulldogs have in these South High School graduates who have given much to our community. Thank you to each of the Charity Newsies!

Bob Cloud – I graduated from South High School in 1966 and Bliss College in 1970 with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. I joined the Columbus Fire Department in 1973 and was assigned to heavy rescue and medic unit for 20 years. I retired in 2001 with the rank of Lieutenant.

I joined the Charity Newsies in 1970 as a 3rd generation Newsie, and served as president in 2003. My father was a Newsie and graduated from South in 1941. My grandfather was Newsie president in 1944. My son Rob is 4th generation Newsie and also a Firefighter. I am still an active Newsie and sell papers at Obetz and High, which I've done for the last 35 years.

I am a member of the Central Ohio Home Plate Club, and was inducted into the Columbus Softball Hall of Fame in 2005. My beautiful wife Barbara and I are retired and enjoy traveling, golfing, and our grandchildren. We have four children and two grandchildren of whom I am very proud.

Nathaniel Woods – I graduated from South High School in June, 1962 and joined the United States Marine Corp. After returning from the Marine Corp I was employed at White (continued on page 7)

Westinghouse for ten years. In 1975 I entered college at Columbus Technical Institute. I graduated with an Associate in General Business Management Technology. I continued at Franklin University (Bachelor of Science in Business Administration) and then obtained a Masters Degree in Education from Ohio University. I became an Associate Professor at Columbus State and taught there for 27 years retiring in 2006.

I joined Charity Newsies while teaching at Columbus State. In 2001 I became president of Charity Newsies. I am an active veteran life member of Charity Newsies. I've served on the boards of two community organizations: Head Start and the Gladden Community House. I continue to do volunteer work and am enjoying my retirement. I am also a proud father and grandfather.

Tom Beck – I graduated from South on June 6, 1950. I enlisted in the United States Marine Corp and served in Korea 1952-1953. I then enrolled at Capital University graduating in June, 1958 with a B.S. in Education. I retired from Columbus Public Schools after 32 years of teaching and coaching.

I joined Charity Newsies in 1962 while teaching at Starling Jr. High School. I observed first hand the positive effect on students that received new clothing from the Newsies. Receiving this help and knowing that someone cared about them boosted their self-esteem, encouraged these students to stay in school and to become good citizens.

I was elected president of the Charity Newsies in 1992. This December 11, 2010, I will be selling the *Columbus Dispatch* special edition of the Charity Newsies newspaper for the 49th consecutive year at the same location, E. Broad Street and I-71 Exit Ramp. My two sons joined the Newsies and are also at this corner. This year my niece, who recently joined the organization, will also be on our corner.

Don Lund – Mr. Lund attended Stewart Ave. Elementary, Barrett Jr. High School, and graduated from South High School in June, 1943. He worked in commercial printing sales for Pfeifer Printing Co., Warner P. Simpson Co. and retired from West-Camp Press in December, 1996.

Mr. Lund has been an active member of Charity Newsies since 1955 and served as Newsie President in 1979. He is also an active member of numerous Masonic organizations in Central Ohio.

Don says he has fond memories of South High School as a school with excellent teachers, high learning standards and a friendly atmosphere all under the guidance of Miss Alva Edwards, Principal and Mr. Verne Smith, Assistant Principal. Don is a committee member for the South High '43 Class Reunions which celebrated their 67th reunion this past June.

Don and his wife Marguerite have raised five children in Westerville where they reside.

Don Kirby

Gail Keys sent the *Bulldog Bulletin* this article from the *Ohio Police and Fire Newsletter*. Ms. Keys say that Mr. Kirby is 88 and that he and his wife of 65 years, Helen, still live in the Columbus area. The SHSAA proudly salutes Mr. Kirby!

This is an excerpt of "One of 'The Greatest Generation' " written by Paul Hillenbrand.

"It amazing how time and circumstance can come together and change one's path in life... Don (Kirby) was born in Wellston, Ohio... his family moved to the south side of Columbus... during the Depression (and he graduated from South)... (Don) loved to play baseball...he was an outstanding catcher and on his way to play ball with the Cincinnati Reds...when the United States entered World War II. He made a choice in 1942 at the age of 20 and enlisted in the Army Air Corps.

...his initial training was as a radio operator... then (he completed) additional training as an aerial gunner...He was finally assigned as one of a crew of six (that) trained together before shipping out for an airfield in England where he and the rest of his crew were assigned to man a B-17.



Don's gunner position on his B-17 bomber was the top turret behind the cockpit. He had safely negotiated his way through three bombing missions. One of those missions was a bombing run over Frankfurt, Germany to damage the Reich's aircraft production facilities. The fourth mission was a return to Frankfurt, however, it was not to be completed. His B-17 sustained heavy damage and the crew was forced to bail out over France. Don was captured and became a prisoner of war. For 18 months he was moved from one location to another, mostly on foot. It was later determined that he had walked 800 miles, partly during one of the coldest winters experienced in Europe. He was able to escape his captors at one point, but his freedom was short-lived...(H)e was recaptured. He was finally liberated in Germany by the British and transported back to the United States where he spent months in rehabilitation... (A)wards he received during his military career are a Silver Star, a Bronze Star with Valor, and a Purple Heart.

Don...married in 1946..returned to playing baseball and got a job as a letter carrier. While walking his daily route...he would often see a police cruiser drive by and he got the idea that being a police officer was the job for him. He joined CPD in 1951 and worked assignments in foot patrol, warrant squad and the motorcycle unit. He retired in 1976 with 25 years of service...he continued to keep in touch with fellow police officers as a Chaplain with the Retired Police Officers' Association. He held that office for the next 30

years. (Don and Helen's) son Jeffrey (South, '66) completed a career with CPD and their grandson Zaneis currently serving with CPD."

5. Publication of all articles is subject to the judgment of the editor/s

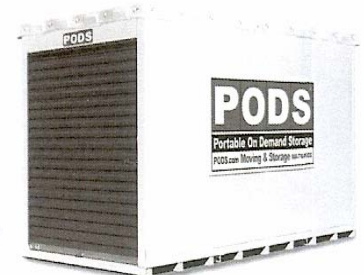

The Charity Newsies

The founding of the philanthropic organization Charity Newsies stems from a cold, blustery day in December 1907, when a small newspaper boy stood on the corner of Broad and High streets. Inside the nearby Billy's Chophouse, entertainers George Baker and Harry Shunk talked to C. C. Philbrick, publisher of the new Ohio Sun



Newspaper about the area's poor children needing clothing. They noticed the newspaper boy and brought him to the Chophouse to get warm. On a spur of the moment they took his newspapers outside, shouting "It's all for charity," and sold all the papers. The money was given to the boy. Realizing potential, the men decided to raise additional funds for the poor by selling the Ohio Sun Newspaper and recruited others to help. On December 20, 1907, the Sunday before Christmas, 50 men sold a special edition of the paper and raised \$702.42, 100% for charity.
